WHY CROSSING THE MIDLINE IS IMPORTANT TO

DEVELOPMENT

Our brains are complex with different parts performing all sorts of jobs, from logical thinking, creative thinking, and analyzing to managing body functions like heart rate and temperature. Many learning differences, such as ADHD, Autism and processing delays are related to disintegration, or the different areas of the brain not working well together.



WHY IS RHYTHMIC WRITING SO IMPORTANT?

With each part of this NILD technique, students cross their midline. This requires the left and right hemispheres of the brain to communicate across a thick band of nerve fibers called the corpus callosum. The more the two sides communicate, the stronger the connections become. These connections allow the brain to process information, perform tasks and manage emotions more efficiently. When completing Rhythmic Writing regularly, students see improvement in concentration, critical thinking, processing speed, and working memory. Some families have even reported physical improvements like better digestion and immune function.

SIGNS THAT A STUDENT MAY HAVE DIFFICULTY CROSSING THE MIDLINE:


- Changing hands midway through a task
- Not having a dominant hand
- Poor penmanship
- Poor hand-eye coordination
- Difficulty visually tracking a moving object



Creative After Care

After-school Program! Because we know it takes a village!

WHAT IS CREATIVE AFTER CARE?

We are an educational after-school program where students will learn to develop and strengthen their social and academic skills as they stretch their creative muscles. We will provide a nurturing and creative environment where your children will thrive. The program is run by a family who together bring over 45 years of educational experience to the program.

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The after-school program will consist of educational activities that are fun along with homework assistance. The students will go through 3-4 rotational blocks where they improve skills in all areas. Rotational block activities will change each quarter.

Rotational Block Activities Will Include:

□Arts & Crafts - Explores the creativity and imagination of every child and adult. It allows them to express themselves in a variety of ways. Arts & crafts also improve psychomotor skills because students increase their influency in the use of their fingers and hands as tools, strengthening their muscles and stimulating the coordination of all their senses, especially when they carry out activities that involve coloring, cutting or making figures or objects as they work with different materials (texture, density, size, etc.).

□Games - Research shows that playing games improves powers of concentration, creativity, memory, languages and teamwork. Our

students will be able to play Chess and board games like Monopoly. All games played will be games appropriate for all age levels.

□**Free-Play -** Free play makes learning fun, natural, and self-driven. Children will get to play and explore so that they can grow

intellectually, socially and emotionally as they choose activities and games they want to play with peers.

□**Lego Story Writing** - With Lego story starters students use bricks, characters, and other accessories to build scenes on which to write their stories. Students work in groups of three to four collaboratively write a story with Legos.

□**STEM Activities -** Fun hands-on science, technology, engineering, and math activities for kids of all ages.
